(1) French Open: Saturday, June 10th Nineteen members took part in our annual French Open Social Tournament. Always well supported, it is an event that features mix and match partnerships, friendly yet competitive tennis, and a pot luck barbeque with a French flavour at the end of play. Tennis balls and French wine were awarded by random draw as prizes. (2) Mixed Doubles Tournament: Saturday, July 22nd

Ten partnerships participated in our first competitive tournament of the season. It continues to be the tournament that draws the greatest participation from our membership, with this year's event being strongly supported.

Balls, drinks, fruit, and light refreshments were provided by the club.

(3) Men's and Ladies Doubles Tournament: Saturday, August 26th Four partnerships in the Ladies draw, and eight pairs in the Men's draw took part in this tournament. In years past, it proved difficult to field sufficient entries to run these two events. That was not the case this season, and a big thank-you goes out to all those who took part. As always, NTC provided balls and light refreshments.

Ladies Doubles champions were Margot Wax and Lisa Webber. Men's champions were Andreas Meyer and Peter Grimwood. Engraved beer mugs were awarded to the winners.

(4) Men's and Ladies Singles Tournament: Saturday, September 9th The last competitive tournament of the summer had four women and eight men competing in their respective events. Again, it was nice to have member interest shown in this tournament, as lack of numbers in past years had often forced cancellation of the competition.

House league update on September 19, 2023:

1. We had a new format in 2023 which changes in both the format and the schedule. A group on WhatsApp was created where the club members can register for a night. A flat fee for the season is 10 dollars.

2. Run it through the season on Mon and Wed nights, 7 till 8-30 pm.

3. There are 51 registrants who have access to the system, some attended only once and did not pay the \$10.00 fees.

4. The first game was planned for May 1, 2023. Since that date, there were 41 events. From 41

total (so far), there were 8 cancellations, 11 times the courts were full and 22 times the courts were not full. There was an issue noted with last minute cancellations, however "no shows" were rare.

5. It requires up to 4 people to run the league through-out the season due to vacations and other commitments.

6. Noted that the range of players ability is very wide. We need to keep the Beginners vs. Advanced players set up. Two days is a good format.

7. Over all the new registration system works fine, and there is a great interest to the house league - 51 people showed interest and signed up for it.

8. Looking forward to the new season and hope for better participation.

There was a sad lack of participation in the junior program this year. We did very similar programing to the year before but we could not gain more participation through the season. It may be that the Friday nights are not the best nights after all and junior drop-ins should be experimented on a different night. and it doesn't seem to draw a crowd!

⑦ Try a different night and maybe a different time to draw more families to come out and play. Possibly include some family play court that could include some younger players.

⁽²⁾ Consider spending some budget on engaging Paula to draw out more players with organized games for younger kids and challenges for older kids.
